

I am an artist who does science, or a scientist who does art – combining research training in cell and molecular biology, neuroscience, and environmental science and policy with my visual arts practice as a researcher, educator, and communicator of art and science. My research interests include cell signaling in neural development and the impact of common environmental toxins on these processes. As an artist I am interested in forms, patterns, and structures inherent in biological systems, as well as making work that inquires broadly about the sensory modalities I study in lab. A second generation printmaker, I make books, prints, and works on paper.
